Academic research and writing is a process that requires active participation and the desire for continual improvement. Academic Research and Writing Consultants are trained professionals ready and willing to assist students through this process. They can assist students at any skill level and at any stage of the writing process – for example, they provide assistance with refining a thesis statement, reviewing the rough draft of a paper, researching a particular topic, offering tutorials in style formatting, etc. Academic Research and Writing Consultants will never complete assignments on behalf of the student.

Our Academic Research and Writing Consultant is available for appointments of up to 60 minutes, which can be scheduled using the link below. Each student is limited to one appointment per week. Once an appointment is scheduled, our Consultant will reach out via email to you to confirm. At least 24 hours before your appointment, you must email a draft of your paper or any other materials to your Consultant for review.
